**1. Play up Scuba Blue's coolness by pairing it with a silver piece.**

**2. Offer an unexpected color combination with a Scuba Blue ensemble and a red jewel (see Versace and Nina Ricci for further study in how it works together).**

**3. Adorn a Scuba Blue outfit with yellow gold and black jewelry for an uncommon but chic effect (see Moschino for example).**

**4. Soften the brightness of a Scuba Blue outfit with a light-color blue jewel.**
